From the Cradle to the Grave? A Politico-economic Approach on Social Security and Public Education

Abstract

We consider an overlapping generations model with pay-as-you-go social security and public education, where the characteristics of these systems are determined through the political process. Pay-as-you-go social security redistributes wealth from young generations to old generations. In contrast, public education is considered to be a intergenerational transfer mechanism from old generations to young generations. We study the relationship between the two-sided intergenerational transfer mechanism and show that both systems can be sustained as the outcome of a Markov perfect equilibrium, even in the absence of intergenerational altruism.
